Deadline to complete your Ontario university application.

The earlier you apply, the better. You can still modify your application after you submit it.



Last day you can expect a response from an Ontario university if you applied by the January 15 deadline.

A response includes an offer of admission, a refusal or a deferral.



The earliest day you may be required to respond to an offer and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration or residence deposit).

All other admission-related elements, including scholarships, other forms of student assistance or financial incentives, and offers of residence, are considered part of the offer of admission.

The most common deadline for confirming offers of admission - but not the only one. Applicants should check their offers of admission for exact deadline dates.

June 1, 2024

The earliest date that colleges may require payment of tuition fees.
