CREATE provides an environment for high school students from across the world to tackle engineering challenges, develop critical thinking skills, and create solutions to global issues.


BLUEPRINT

ABOUT NATIONAL PORTFOLIO DAY

WHAT IS THE NATIONAL PORTFOLIO DAY ASSOCIATION?

The National Portfolio Day Association (NPDA) was established in 1978 solely for the organization and planning of National Portfolio Day events. Today, the Association continues this work and has broadened its mission to provide support to professionals advising students on portfolio development for college/university admission. Consisting of more than 100 post-secondary institutions that hold regional accreditation and accreditation from the National Association of Schools of Art and Design (NASAD), or its equivalent, NPDA is the only organization of its kind and its membership represents the highest standard of visual arts education available in the world.

WHAT ARE NATIONAL PORTFOLIO DAYS?

National Portfolio Days are free, studentfocused events held annually in multiple locations across the United States, Canada and Europe. Virtual events are also hosted to afford greater access to students unable to attend in-person events. They are designed to provide a unique opportunity for students to meet individually with professional representatives of accredited colleges and universities and to receive valuable feedback and guidance on their portfolio before it is submitted as part of their graduate applications. WHY ARE NATIONAL PORTFOLIO DAYS VALUABLE?

National Portfolio Days may be the first time a student experiences an environment where they are surrounded by other artists, all of whom share a powerful commitment to art and design. Students are encouraged to use this as an opportunity to be inspired, make connections, and gain advice about improving and presenting their portfolio. The events truly offer a small taste of what it is like to attend aprofessional art and design program.

For many students, attending a National Portfolio Day will be the first time they are presenting their portfolio, and this can be intimidating. Students should know these events intend to facilitate an exchange of ideas and information, not to be an examination or competition. Ultimately, the representatives want to be a helpful resource by offering advice on portfolio development while learning about the students, their work and creative decision-making.

Please note, no admission decisions or scholarship awards will be offered at National Portfolio Days. Some representatives may accept a portfolio as the visual portion of an application for admission to their college or university. Others have restrictions that prohibit them from making adefinitive portfolio decision at the time of the review. All representatives are happy to discuss their specific programs of study and provide answers to questions about the availability of scholarships and financial aid.

The Loran Award supports promising young Canadians who show strength of character and a commitment to service in their communities, challenging them to fully realize their leadership potential. In 2023-24, the Loran Scholars Foundation will offer up to 160 financial awards funding studies on Canadian campuses at the following three levels:

LORAN AWARDS

With the support of a national network, up to 36 Loran Scholars are provided with: an annual stipend and tuition waiver to enable their capacity and availability to engage with and contribute to their new communities; a comprehensive, thoughtfully-developed leadership enrichment program including a variety of summer work experiences, immersive learning in different parts of Canada and abroad, skills and capacity building; membership in a community of values-driven individuals, including a diverse network of past and present scholars, one-on-one mentoring, and annual retreats and forums for high- potential youth to interact and learn from one another.

Loran Scholars may pursue undergraduate studies at the following universities only:

Alberta, British Columbia (UBC), Calgary, Dalhousie, Guelph, King's, Laval, McGill, McMaster, Manitoba, Memorial, Montréal (UdM), Mount Allison, New Brunswick (UNB), Ottawa, Queen's, Saskatchewan, Sherbrooke, Simon Fraser, Toronto (UofT), Toronto Metropolitan, Waterloo, Western, Victoria, York.

Loran Scholars must meet university and program admission requirements. To renew the award, Loran Scholars must maintain a B+ (77%) CPGA under a full course load, live independently, including in university residence for the first year of study, and demonstrate growth in character, service, and leadership.

FINALIST AWARDS

Up to 54 one-time awards valued at \$6,000 offered to finalists not selected as Loran Scholars for use at any public Canadian university.

PROVINCIAL & TERRITORIAL AWARDS

Up to 70 one-time awards valued at \$2,000 offered to top candidates chosen by interview committees, for use at any public Canadian university.

ELIGIBILITY

Eligibility criteria for high school students

- Be graduating from high school in 2024.

 Note: Students who graduated in 2023 and are currently taking a gap year are eligible to apply.
- Present a minimum cumulative average of 85%.
- Hold Canadian citizenship or permanent resident status.
- Be born between January 1, 2002 and September 1, 2008.

Eligibility criteria for Cegep students in Quebec

- Be in their final year of studies in Cegep before entering university.
- Present a minimum overall R Score of 29.
- Hold Canadian citizenship or permanent resident status.
 - Be born between January 1, 2002 and
- ☑ September 1, 2008.

Please note: Semi-final interviews are online. For students without Internet capability at home, we will work with them to secure a location where they can access the Internet. If we are unsuccessful, they will be interviewed by phone. National Selections are held in Toronto and all costs associated with travel and accommodations are covered by Loran.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ALL APPLICANTS

- Review the information at loranscholar.ca/becoming-a-scholar thoroughly before beginning the official application process.
- The application is entirely online. You do not need to mail anything. Complete the application at apply.loranscholar.ca. However, applicants without sufficient Internet bandwidth to apply online may mail in a hard copy application. Contact info@loranscholar.ca or 416-646-2120 x100 for more information.
- You will need to request a **reference** from a teacher, community member, or someone else who is familiar with your activities. The reference may not be a family member or friend.

Note: The reference letter must be completed by the application deadline. It can only be completed after you have finished your section of the application. Make sure you give your reference writer ample time to complete their portion of the application before the deadline. It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure all elements of the application are submitted on time.

Shortlisted applicants submit a supplementary video.

Online semi-final interviews for shortlisted applicants. Candidates will be invited at least one week before their interview day. Interviews will be held during the day Monday to Friday.

Week of December 18

Semi-final results shared with candidates. 90 finalists will be invited to National Selections.

2024

February 22-25

Finalists will attend National Selections in Toronto and costs to attend are covered by the Loran Scholars Foundation.

The most common deadline for confirming offers of admission - but not the only one. Applicants should check their offers of admission for exact deadline dates.

June 1, 2024

The earliest date that colleges may require payment of tuition fees.
