School updates:

- Leadership fundraiser buy-in for sports last week girls' volleyball
- EQAO grade 9 math testing 3 days will discuss more later
- Literacy results for fall semester students have been given results and North's results overall and throughout the Board were very impressive – there is a second opportunity to write this again for students if needed, these students will be contacted for follow up
- Feedback recovery and improvement announcements have been made for students and teachers have talked to students about this process during class time; for the last few weeks assessments, culminating tasks, tests, exams, portfolios, projects, products, etc, were provided to students to allow students be successful in their courses – the message that has been conveyed to students by teachers and on VTV Announcements is: Everyone is invited to attend and need to be focused and in classes working on those days. - Sports and other activities that are going on very busy with many sports both intramural and school teams competing. Lots of opportunity to get involved.
- December staff did a number of fundraisers and gift cards were purchased to help throughout the community and students
- Grade 8 Open House was January 17 many attended
- Enrolment is up for next semester including students and families that are new to Canada enrolments the school admin are working with community partners to make this a successful start for them.

 Grade 8 Night – Wednesday January 17, 2024 – This event went well, but it felt like there was little awareness of the Community Resources that were participating in the Library. Hopefully there can

- Fundraising ideas food program food availability for students
 - a. Overview of concern / issue brought forward at last
 meeting looking for potential fundraising ideas: Kim Hand
 please see the notes from last month's meeting.
 - b. In school opportunities fundraisers
 - North's Wellness committee has been discussing the needs that are being seen related to food access for students – partnered with 2 cooking classes for creation of food in more spaces and are using in-school fridges and freezers for storage of this food.
 - Student success has bagels etc. food also available in other spaces like the Lodge and more Café Cash is now available.
 - Fox's Bakery the school is working with them and has inquiries in to try and get food donated
 - COBBS bakery may donate to schools we need to look further into this.
 - Dino's pizza have donated tickets for free slices and a pop for students.
 - Good Food box program SAC will be helping with creation of the boxes and promoting this to students for additional helping hands – The were also asking if money could be donated to help decrease the costs of this program for those in need in our Community - Fundraising money could go to this to help with this project.
 - Donations of food from members of community has been occurring and being distributed as needed.



- Green Industry courses / interest for interior and exterior courtyards is a focus for Ms. Hand hopefully for next year – could be included in Tech courses and could help students to understand how to build their own sustainable gardens and food sources.
- Gardening Club Environmental Science Course green space renewal – looking for interest in this amongst the students which may also include different and appropriate use of court yards for next few years – to increase use and make these more sustainable for student use.

It was decided that the sign / banner and the guest speaker would be great events to run, and that if there is money left over that it would be spent on pens as handouts to parents. There are also tote bags that are available that will be handed out to parents at second semester Teacher interview night.

- **3. Grade 9 EQAO Assessment of Mathematics:** January 23-26, 2024 these assessments took place.
